1.YOU'VE BEEN ADMITTED



ULCO is located along the English Channel and North Sea coast, right in the heart of three vibrant port cities: Boulogne-sur-Mer, Calais, and Dunkirk, as well as in Saint-Omer, further inland.

Situated in the Hauts-de-France region, at the gateway to Northern Europe and just 200 kilometers from Paris, Brussels, and London, ULCO benefits from a prime geographical location.

It's important to carefully prepare your documents before arriving in France and to complete your university registration.





Applying for a Visa

Except for residents of the European Economic Area, Monaco, Andorra, and Switzerland, you will need a visa to enter and study in France.

If you come from a country where the "Études en France" procedure does not exist, please check the website of the French embassy in your country of residence to follow the student visa application process.

The processing time varies depending on the country and the time of year, but usually takes several weeks. It is therefore important to start your application well in advance.

If you come from a country where the "Études en France" procedure does exist, please consult the Campus France website for guidance on your application process.

Budget Planning

To help you prepare your budget, here is an estimated average monthly budget you will need (for guidance only):

Housing: 500€ Meals: 300€

Transportation: 50€ (in Dunkirk and Calais, buses are free)

Personal expenses / Leisure: €100

Keep in mind that there are additional initial costs to consider, such as university registration fees, the CVEC contribution, rental deposits, etc.

Also, be sure to check the tuition fees for your specific program, as these can vary depending on several factors. You can find this information on the university's website.





Student Life and Campus Contribution(CVEC)



Every student enrolling in initial higher education studies must provide proof of payment or exemption for the Student Life and Campus Contribution (CVEC) before registering.

The CVEC helps fund a wide range of initiatives aimed at improving student life on campus.

With Visale, rent with peace of mind

If you're between 18 and 30 years old, Visale can act as a guarantor for your rental — a helpful solution if you don't have a guarantor in France. Learn more and apply online through the official Visale platform.





You may be eligible for housing support through the Caisse d'Allocations Familiales (CAF).

To qualify, you must meet certain conditions — for example, holding a Long-Stay Visa (VLS-TS) or a Residence Permit.

Important: It may take several months to receive the first payments. You will need to pay your full rent during the waiting period while your visa is validated and your application is processed.

Understanding Health Coverage in France

Health insurance is mandatory for any stay in France lasting more than 3 months.

Students from the EU, EEA or Switzerland

Before arriving in France, request your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).
It must be valid for the entire duration of your stay.

This card is required and ensures you are covered by your home country's health insurance during your studies.

Students from Québec

You must obtain a certificate from the Régie de l'Assurance Maladie du Québec (RAMQ) before coming to France.
This is the only recognized process to benefit from health coverage as a Quebec student.

Students from Other Countries

After enrolling at ULCO, you'll need to register for the French national health insurance (Sécurité Sociale).
This step is essential to access healthcare services during your stay.
Registration is done online via the official platform: https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr





Student Health Services at ULCO

All students have access to free on-campus health services in: Boulogne-sur-Mer · Calais · Dunkerque · Saint-Omer

What's available:

- Preventive health consultations and nurse appointments
- Emergency contraception
- Support for students with disabilities (accommodations for exams or courses)
- Health check-ups, vaccinations, and assistance for international students

How to Get to ULCO and Get Around

Located in a strategic region of northern France, ULCO is easily accessible from major cities in France and abroad.



Getting to ULCO by Train

From Paris-Orly Airport : Take the Orlyval shuttle to Antony station, then transfer to RER B towards Gare du Nord (~35 min).

From Paris-CDG Airport (Roissy): Take the shuttle to the RER B station (Charles de Gaulle 2 TGV), direction Gare du Nord (~€15). Note: Some TGV trains depart directly from CDG Airport to ULCO cities via Lille.

From Gare du Nord (Paris): Take the TGV to Lille, then a regional train to your campus. (~1h30/2h)

From Brussels Airport : Regular shuttles connect the airport to Brussels Central Station. From there, take a train to Lille.

From London: Take the Eurostar to Lille. Budget around €160 one-way or €300 return.

From Lille Station (regional train fares):

- Lille → Dunkerque: ~€15
- Lille → Calais: ~€20
- Lille → Boulogne-sur-Mer: ~€25
- Lille → Saint-Omer: ~€15

Getting to ULCO by Car

Paris → Dunkerque: ~300 km via A1 and A25 (Toll: ~€20)

Paris → Calais: ~295 km via A1 and A26 (Toll: ~€20)

Paris → Saint-Omer: ~260 km via A1 and A26 (Toll: ~€18)

Paris → Boulogne-sur-Mer: ~280 km via A1, A26, and A16 (Toll: ~€21)



3. MAIN ADMINISTRATIVE STEPS

Fulfilling the CVEC Requirement

Before completing your university enrollment, you must provide proof of payment for the CVEC.

The Contribution to Student and Campus Life (CVEC) helps fund student services such as healthcare, sports, cultural activities, and student initiatives.



Validating Your Long-Stay Visa

You must validate your long-stay visa online within three months of your arrival in France.

If you hold a "minor enrolled in school" visa, please contact ULCO's International Relations Office to find out the specific procedure to follow.

Important: If you plan to renew your residence permit, you must submit your request online within the two months prior to its expiration





Note: Algerian students must follow a specific procedure to obtain a residence permit.

Opening a Bank Account

Opening a bank account in France is highly recommended, as it will simplify many administrative and financial tasks during your stay.

Typically, you'll need the following documents:

- A valid ID (identity card or passport)
- Proof of address in your name (such as a rental contract, university residence certificate, utility bill, etc.)
- A student card (optional, but may give access to student discounts)

Please note: A temporary housing agreement is not usually accepted. In most cases, the rental contract must include your name.

Getting Internet Access

Once you have signed your rental agreement and opened a bank account, you can subscribe to a monthly internet plan from one of the service providers in France.

The university also offers free Wi-Fi access on campus. You can log in using your ULCO student credentials.



Living on Campus

Student ID Card

This smart card makes daily life easier across ULCO campuses. It is shared by universities and schools throughout the region and offers several practical features:

- Pay for meals at any CROUS restaurant or cafeteria
- Borrow books and materials from university libraries
- Access certain ULCO buildings
- Pay for photocopies in the libraries





After your enrollment is complete, an activation email will be sent to your university email address only. Once your IZLY account is activated, you can top up your digital wallet online or via your smartphone using a credit card, bank account, account-to-account transfer, or even a payment from someone else through your personal IZLY space.

The Library (BULCO)

The ULCO Library Network (BULCO) offers access to more than 150,000 documents across four locations and provides a wide range of services:

- A vast collection of textbooks, reference works, journals, DVDs, maps, as well as movies, comics, and novels
- Free-access computers and tablets (available with your student ID card)
- · Group study rooms and Wi-Fi access
- With your multi-service card (CMS), you can borrow up to 10 books or journals and 3 DVDs for two weeks, with one renewal possible via your online reader account on maBULCO
- Thousands of online resources are available both on campus and remotely after logging in through the BULCO website



Cultural and Sports Activities

ULCO offers a wide range of sports and physical activities for all levels—from recreational to competitive. Through SUAPS (the University Service for Physical and Sports Activities), you can integrate sports into your academic experience.



Culture

ULCO also provides a rich and diverse cultural program throughout the year, coordinated by the Cultural Affairs Office (SCC), which operates in various locations:

- La Piscine and La Chapelle
- Student Centers (Maisons de l'Étudiant MDE)
- University Libraries







La Piscine – Dunkirk

This cultural venue hosts workshops, training sessions, and performances in the performing arts. From October to June, it offers a multidisciplinary program including theater, music, and more. An annual membership costs just €1 and gives you free access to all events.

La Chapelle – Boulogne-sur-Mer

This venue hosts concerts, Zumba classes, exhibitions, and film screenings. The SCC also organizes a live performance each trimester.

Student Centers (Maisons de l'Étudiant – MDE)

The MDEs offer a space for cultural activities, relaxation, and student engagement.

You'll find:

- Administrative services (career advising, social workers, etc.)
- Offices for student associations
- Performance spaces and student cafés



These centers are lively places where you can express yourself, meet others, and fully engage in campus life.

Student Life & Disability Support Office (BVEH)


Because student life goes beyond the classroom, the Student Life and Disability Support Office (BVEH) is here to support you in all aspects outside of academics.

As a student at ULCO, you can connect to Wi-Fi across all campuses using your ENT login credentials. The eduroam network is also available, allowing you to stay connected when visiting partner universities in France or abroad.

Improve Your French

The Language Resource Centre (CRL) offers both on-campus and online support to help you strengthen your language skills. You'll have access to digital resources on the CALAO platform (which should be explored each semester), as well as guidance from tutors, language assistants, and instructors throughout your studies.

At ULCO, you can earn the Certificat de Compétences en Langues de l'Enseignement Supérieur (CLES) for free. This national certification validates your language proficiency in English, German, or Spanish at B1 or B2 level. It is integrated into the third year of undergraduate (L3) and second year of master's (M2) programs and is a valuable asset for your CV.



The FUN MOOC platform offers a variety of free online courses, including French language classes. These flexible courses let you learn at your own pace while exploring new topics of interest.
